He has also served as a legal fellow to then-Vice Chairman U.S. Senator Udall (ret.) on the Senate Committee on Indian Affairs, supporting policy development and agency oversight, and as a policy fellow to U.S. Senator Dorgan (ret.) at the Aspen Institute, supporting the Obama administration. Before law and policy, Joaquin worked in health care and research across Indian Country including interior Alaska.
