Roshanna K. Toya is an enrolled member of the Pueblo of Isleta in New Mexico. She earned her Juris Doctorate from the University of New Mexico School of Law in 2019. There she received the clinical honors award for her work in the Southwest Indian Law Clinic, the Dean's Award for significant contribution to the law school community, and served as Co-Editor in Chief of the Tribal Law Journal. Roshanna also holds graduate degrees in social work and criminal justice. Since graduating from law school she has served as a judicial law clerk for the New Mexico Court of Appeals. As a law clerk she conducts legal research and drafts legal opinions on complex questions in all areas of criminal and civil law. Roshanna has also served her tribal community as an associate justice for the Pueblo's Appellate Court for the past eight years.
